## Session Overview

The IPT Engagement Series gives Vancouver PCN allied health practitioners a platform to showcase how they work – sharing knowledge, building connections, and learning across disciplines. This session focused on **diabetes**: medication, referral criteria, diabetes management strategies, and the roles of clinical pharmacists and registered dietitians in supporting patients.

## Key Content Areas

### PCN Clinical Pharmacists Role

Pharmacists will complete a comprehensive medication review, glycemic optimization, and cardiovascular risk reduction. Can support in patient cost navigation.

### Registered Dietitians will provide client-centred care

Provides culturally relevant, weight-neutral, trauma-informed diabetes management and cardiovascular risk reduction services. Has multi-language resources.

### Nutrition Intervention is essential


A variety of methods to support sustainable food choices. Will assess patient's eating habits and nutritional concerns.

**A case study was highlighted.** 50-year-old male with Type 2 diabetes (HgA1c 8%). Referred to optimize medication, provide patient education, and address risk reduction. Went over ABCDESSS of Diabetes Care and referral exclusions.
