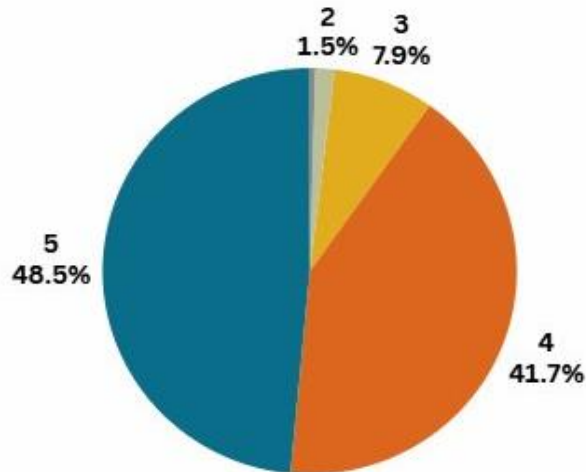

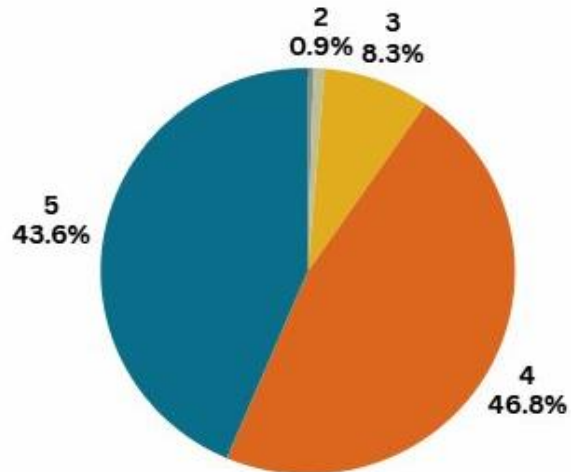

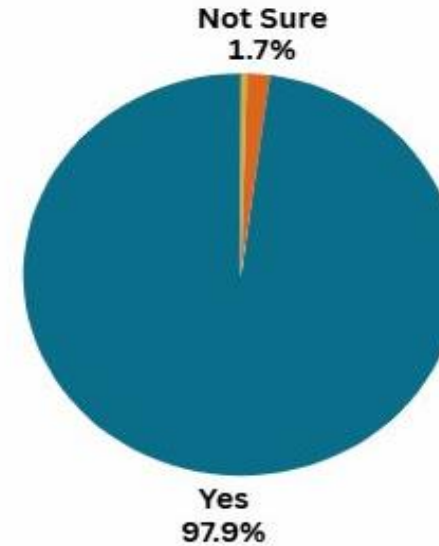

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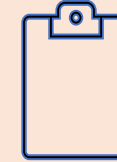
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"Important information as to what the role of allied health is and how they are able to complement/support/and improve health of shared patients. Very grateful for your help."
