SOCIAL WORKER 🔆

- Understand the following for the client:
 - Financial stressors
 - Housing
 - Taxes
 - Disability
- Interventions are highly dependent on patient demographics

Interventions for a patient within PCN 6:

- Housing counselling, BC Housing application, Ministry funding, furniture assistance
- Food Security Gordon Neighbourhood House, West End Church, Quest referral
- Other Financial Supports West End Seniors Network, Telus Connecting for Good, Federal Rent Assistance
- Mental Health Support consult with MRP re psych referral, panic attacks, assess readiness for clinical counselling
- Other Referrals PCN Dietitian, Employment Supports

CLINICAL COUNSELLOR 1



Target:

- Assess patient's readiness for clinical counselling considering recent panic attacks and generalized anxiety
 - Can happen in MRP clinic or with IPT referral
 - Chronic vs. acute concerns
 - Has mental health been identified as primary concern
 - Is this person in a position to engage in therapeutic behaviour?

Interventions:

- Offer support based of patient's immediate needs
- If clinical counselling is not indicated due to other concerns, offer brief supportive counselling with resources to access further supportive counselling services in the community
- Provide support in effort of reducing suffering
- Consider other Referrals PCN Clinical Pharmacist

FICTIONAL CASE STUDY

Provider refers patient to Social Worker for support

Patient:

- 56-year-old woman (she/her) seeking financial assistance
- Client reports interpersonal conflict with family led to unexpected acute financial concerns
- Client seeking assistance with housing and financial stability

Psychosocial Assessment – Social Determinants of Health

- Temporary housing, unaffordable
- MRP supported PWD application and client receives benefit
- Minimal savings, interested and able to work
- No social support
- GAD dx 10 years ago, hoping for psychiatry evaluation
- Denied substance use
- Recent unexplained weight loss
