SWITCH BC's Community Physician Health and Safety (CPHS) program is now ready to support your clinic's health and safety program development.

Areas of focus might include incident response, managing risks, non-medical emergency preparedness, worker training, and preventing violence in your clinic. Outcomes could include creating safer workplaces, ensuring WorkSafeBC regulations are met, improving team communication, and managing safety events effectively.

Commitment involves a phone or virtual meeting with the CPHS program team to assess your current state before onsite support (e.g. strengths-based assessment) and follow-up with findings and recommendations to enhance safety. We would work with you, your office staff, or designate on health and safety needs unique to your clinic. There is no cost associated.

We will explore how we could best assist you in making health and safety easier in your clinic. The following topics may help physicians and their staff focus our shared work.

- Learning how to complete workplace inspections
- Responding when an incident occurs
