
(63) have a community-based longitudinal family practice (LFP)

Family Doctors are providing Palliative Care to:

- Patients in their Longitudinal Practice (LP)
- Patient in LTC from their LP
- Patient in hospice outside their LP
- Patients outside their LP
- Patients in hospital outside their LP
- Patient in LTC outside their LP
- Patients in hospital within their LP
- Patients in hospice within their LP
